ROW WITH TEAMSTERS.

San Francisco Police Use Their Clubs Freely on the Strikers.

San Francisco, Cal., July 26 .- There were several developments in the local strike today. First in importance came te decision of Superior Judge Sloss, the issued an injunction restraining Cosks and Waiters' alliance from picketing men in front of non-union staurants for the purpose of divertg customers.

The injunction absolutely prohibits the strikers from persuading or induc-ing persons in the employ of a res-taurant-keeper to leave his employ, rom seeking to prevent other persons ealing with him and from the use of the word "unfair" or other defamamy statements calculated to injure is business

Only two instances of serious trouble were reported. A clash between union and non-union men took place at the stables of McNab & Smith on Brannan street. The non-union teamsters were reparing to drive out for the day's work and there were a dozen of them on hand. Several policemen were also there to guard the non-union men.

Just as the drivers left the barn a crowd of 250 union teamsters appeared and importuned the drivers not to go work. These importunities were met y refusals and then the men became agressive. Their ranks were con-santly augmented and in a short while the crowd had grown to formida proportions. The teams were haltd and attempts were made to drag the men from the wagons. Bricks, tocks and other missiles were freely thrown and several persons were struck. The police then changed with their clubs and for a time fighting was general.

One or two of the non-union teamthe or two or the non-unon team Rers were badly beaten and ten or iwelye union men had been knocked down before the police succeeded in dearing the strend. There were many clearing the street. There were many bloody facs in evidence.

Another crowd of union teamsters stopped a team belonging to the Calfornia Cannerles company, on Folsom street, between Second and Third, and stacked the driver, who was dragged into the street and unmercifully beaten. Topeka, Kan., July 26 .- General rains throughout Kansas today have caused an officctual break in the drouth. The rains came too late to be of material benefit to the corn, but will result in plenty of stock water and giving new life to the pastures. The scarcity of water in some of the smaller cities had gotten to be a serious problem, as there was not enough of it for ordinary drinking purposes. The rain in Topeka lasted an hour this afternoon.
