An Ordinance Relating to Butchering and Slaughtering.

SEC. 1.—Be it ordained by the City Council of Salt Lake City: That it shall not be lawful for any person or persons, to erect any slaughterhouse or yard, or engage in the business of butchering within the limits of said city without first obtaining license therefor, nor at any place or places other than such as may be designated by said council.

SEC. 2.—Applications for license under the provisions of this ordinance, shall be made to the Mayor in writing, and licenses shall be issued and signed by the Mayor or presiding officer of the City Council, and attested by the City Recorder, under the corporate seal, on the payment into the City Treasury, of the sum of twenty-five dollars per annum, in advance.

SEC. 3.—All persons licensed as butchers shall keep a book in which they shall record a faithful description of the age, size and color of all animals by them killed, with the brands and ear marks thereon, together with the name of the person from whom received and the time when killed; which book shall be open to the inspection of the public.

SEC. 4.—All persons engaged in the business of butchering within the limits of this city are hereby required to thoroughly cleanse their slaughterhouses and yards, once each twenty-four hours, and to remove from their premises and deposit all offal in such manner, and at such place or places, as may be designated by the City Marshal, or his deputy.

SEC. 5.—It shall be the duty of the City Marshal or his deputy (as often as may be deemed necessary) to visit the slaughterhouses within the limits of this city, to examine the books and see that a faithful record is made of all animals killed, and that the slaughterhouses are thoroughly cleansed, as provided by section four of this ordinance.

SEC. 6.—Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be liable to a fine, not more than one hundred dollars, and on a second conviction in addition thereto, his license may be declared forfeited.

SEC. 7.—All ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting with this ordinance are hereby repealed. Passed November 24th, 1874. DANIEL H. WELLS, Mayor.
