

GENERAL STOCK DRIVE FOR G. S. L. COUNTY.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that there will be a General Drive of HORSES, MULES and CATTLE on the Public Range of this county, commencing on TUESDAY the 24th inst., as follows:

The stock running on the range south of a line running west from the Big Cottonwood to the Harker Springs, on both sides of the River Jordan, will be gathered to the Corrals of A. Beckstead, near the Jordan Mills, and delivered to owners at 2 o'clock on WEDNESDAY the 25th.

On THURSDAY the 26th, the stock running on said range north of the above-mentioned line will be gathered to the Church Corral G. S. L. City, together with the stock not taken out at Beckstead's and delivered to owners on THURSDAY, at 2 o'clock the 26th.

Any person having stock on said range that they do not wish drove will do well to see to them before the drive.

One dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50) will be charged per head for all stock thus gathered to pay expenses.

The Bishop's of the City and County are requested to notify the people of their Wards to gather up their stock, and deliver over to the Stray Poundkeeper or Drivers, all stray or transient stock, that the owners may find them with the general drive.
