Washington, Oct. 29 .- To train the Washington, Oct. 29.—To train the Indians In agricultural pursuits on a broader and more practical scale, the Indian bureau has undertaken the pro-ject of installing model farms on all Indian reservations, with teachers who have been trained in scientific agricul-tural schools.
