## BREVITIES.

In seven counties of Kentucky no person pays an income tax.

Of the 2,000 and more varieties of pears described and known to those who make pomology a study, only about seventy or eighty are counted as truly valuable.

A family by the name of Turnbull have filled the position of Clerk of Brunswick county, Virginia, for 133 years. General Stoneman removed the last of them from office.

A man in Newburyport (Mass.) has ten acres of land in onions. The ten acres give eighty miles of onions, and in planting, hoeing, weeding and gathering require a thousand miles' travel.

It is announced that Senator Sumner, on the invitation of Nye of Nevada, will visit that State some time during the present summer. He will accompany Nye to the leading silver mines of Nevada, and finally bring up at San Francisco.

There was an eruption of Mount Jolima, in Mexico on the 12th June, the whole mountain was crowned with fire. This was its first outbreak since 1804.

A French journal is responsible for the following: In a certain small provincial town one of the residents, M. A. B., found that his house was rendered damp and dark by the contiguity of a large tree, which was inconveniently near his windows. He would have had it cut down, but the tree belonged to the commune and was not to be meddled with. Being a man of resources, he sent for insertion to one of the Paris papers the following paragraph: "There is still in existence one of the trees of liberty of the date of 1793. It may be seen at X., close to the house of M. A. B., and the passers-by reverently uncover their heads to this venerable witness of our grandest struggles and our most illustrious victory." Three days afterward an order came from the Prefecture in Paris for the Mayor of X., to cause the said tree to be cut down, which was accordingly done forthwith.

In a recent English work on the tensile strength of iron and steel, it is announced, as the result of an extended series of experiments, that for such iron as is usually employed for rails in Paris, Belgium and Wales the breaking strength, as tested by sudden blows or shocks, is considerably influenced by cold. Such iron exhibits, at 10 degrees Fahrenheit, only from one-third to one-fourth the strength which it possesses at 84 degrees. The conclusion is drawn from these experiments that the only practical way to prevent railway accidents during severe frosts and winter weather is to slacken rods, or to give the rolling more elasticity by the employment of India rubber springs.

The cotton mills in the United States are 6527 in number, running 9,585,082 spindles, and consuming 417,387,771 pounds of cotton per annum. This gives to each mill an average of 1163 spindles, and a consumption of 63,945 pounds of cotton per annum. The statistics, arranged according to the great geographical divisions of the country, are as follows: Northern States, 6451 mills, running 7,359,020 spindles, consuming 385,952,021 pounds of cotton annually. This gives to each of the mills in the Northern States an average of 1142 spindles, and an annual consumption of 69,921 pounds of cotton, and each of the mills in the Southern States an average of 268 spindles, and an annual consumption of 255,299 pounds of cotton. The mills in the Southern States, it will be perceived, are large establishments.

A curious controversy has been raging in England through the columns of the Daily News touching the possibility of converting Jews to Christianity in any considerable number. It was begun by an Episcopal clergyman, who wrote denouncing the London Society as a humbug, and saying that the conversion of each Jew cost £10,000, and even at that price there could be no certainty as to its genuineness. Whereupon, at the next meeting of the Hebrew Christian Alliance, the Chairman denounced him as a shame and disgrace to the church, and said that society had within a year converted seventy Jews. A foreign Christian Jew wrote, however, supporting the clergyman, and was followed by an English Christian Jew, who charged the Society with being "one of the greatest shams of the age," and asserting that "no educated, respectable Jew had been converted through its instrumentality," or any Jew whatever without an accompanying improvement in his temporal condition. Another Jew challenges the Society to produce the seventy converts, and the contest seems to wax hotter as it goes.

Women possess the right to vote more exclusively than is generally supposed. In Austria, women can vote as nobles, in their corporate capacity as nurses, and as taxpayers. In some cases however, they vote by proxy. In Hungary, up to 1848, widows, and single women who were landed proprietors, possessed the right to vote. They were deprived of it by the Revolutionary Government, and are now petitioning for the restoration of this right. In Canada, as in several of our States, women are allowed to vote for and serve as school trustees. In the British Australian colony of Victoria, women universally assumed the right to vote about four years ago, having found that the law had been so framed as to permit them. In Sweden, chiefly through the exertions of the late Frederika Bremer, an indirect right of voting was, in 1862, granted to women possessing specified property qualifications. In Italy a widow, or wife separated from her husband, may vote if she pays taxes. Also, in Holland, single women possessing property are entitled to vote on all questions likely to affect its value. In many towns in France women possess and exercise the right to vote in municipal affairs.
