MARKET TAKES AN UNEXPECTED TURN

Iron Blossom Orders Come in From Tintio and Higher Prices Prevail.

OTHER TINTIOS STRENGTHEN

Ohio Copper a Favorite Among the Unlisted—Closing Quotations And Sales.

There was a decided upward tendency to stocks noticed during today's sessions of the mining exchange and it was somewhat unexpected. Nearly everyone had settled down to the conclusion that there would be "little doing" until after election. But orders for Iron Blossom came in from Tintio on the strength of the striking of the lime bed in the new shaft, which is regarded by some Tintio miners as being a sure indication of an ore body. At any rate, they are willing to back up their judgment with a little money and are buying the stock, which opened on a sale of \$1.00, which was followed by an advance to \$2.02, receding again right at the close. Colorado came forth in good form and was bought at \$3 and \$3.02; Mason Valley went up to \$2.05; Sioux Consolidated advanced from \$1.10 to \$1.15; while Black Jack ended higher.

Of the unlisted stocks, Ohio Copper was again a favorite, with sales reported at \$3.60; Bingham Central Standard went at 38 cents and Silver King Coalition at \$3.02.

Kindergarten Seven Troughs Plant Repaired—Eclipse Mine.

Vernon, Nev., Oct. 22.—After having been shut down for nearly a month, the mill on the Kindergarten property has resumed operation again. The cause of the inactivity was a broken shaft. Some annoyance was caused through the delay in getting repairs from Salt Lake.

Conditions at the property of the Seven Troughs Eclipse Mining company are reported to be very satisfactory. The new shaft is down 250 feet and the bottom is in a formation which gives the management all kinds of encouragement. The work of development is being conducted under the direction of Manager William J. Craig.
