Manager E, J. Radditz of the Tintic Standard company has returned from his eastern trip, extending over several weeks, and says business prospects for the middle west are brighter than they have been for a long time past.

The Independent smelter at Ogden has been making a splendid showing recently, under the management of F. H. Larchen, who has succeeded in cutting down materially the slag loss, and

at the same time increasing the output by about 25 per cent. It is said that the increase of the smelters' capacity is one of the things now being considered. The property of the Utah Apex company is said to have recently increased is underground ore reserves till they amount to \$3,500,000. This would be equal to about \$6 a share.
