A Day of Tragedies in the State of Arizona Plated on Record.

A MYSTERIOUS DISAPPEARANCE.

Partial Destruction of a Dam in Arizona.—Claim Against the U. S. Government, Etc.

The Colorado River has just made its appearance. It is a mystery, and is destined to have strong financial tact.

There is complaint from many sections of New Mexico that rain is now needed to put the range in good condition and replenish the water supply.

Sixteen thousand sheep, making nearly four train loads, have been shipped from Los Angeles, New Mexico, to the Maxwell land grant.

Judge Henry Layton of Grand Junction, Colo., has disappeared. We are told he has a large sum of money, and if it is found, he has been murdered.

The Gila Gold in Arizona is another warning in regard to the necessity of care in the construction of dams, particularly for irrigation reservoir purposes, says the Denver News.

Christopher Allen has been fined \$100 and costs at Moab, Nev., for scaling rocks at Moab. He was fined according to \$100, and costs in jail to pay the fine at the rate of \$2 per day.

Mrs. May Fashman, convicted at Butte, Mont., of manslaughter in causing the death of her infant through cruelty and neglect, has been sentenced to one year in the penitentiary.

The week, H. Smith, M. L. Knott and others staged a cartoon contest, \$500 being the grand prize, in Kansas City. They received \$2 cents a ballot for them, which is considered a very fair price.—*Argus*.

One of the many signs now looming up in the California legislature says the *Northwestern Live Stock Journal* is the star of the newspaper in regard to the law. It is a sign that the law is in the hands of those who will see the laws driven in, breaking back and forth between the men and women parties. The butch representatives are strong for the law, but bear a long fight against it.

The mail rider between Aqua Caliente and Palmers, on the San Joaquin River, rode his route in advance of the flood last Thursday between the sheer points, also the narrow escape of children attending school at Palmers. He arrived at Palmers, a distance of twelve miles, to find the river had overflowed, particularly there in the school, the children having only time to mount horses, leaving the race for life and escape after a run of six miles.

Cass County (Iowa) since J. H. Wise will start the mill at the Iron Mountain Mine as soon as the weather will permit, and the present situation will be far from plenty of work for the mill running. Mr. Wise is superintendent and general manager and has full control of the Donisthorpe property, on which we understand he will save no expense in getting it in condition to net the owners a handsome profit on the investment.

Governor Prince of New Mexico has received a United States treasury warrant for \$50,000 in payment of New Mexico's proportion of the direct tax. In a few days more the various territorial legislatures will receive the money that has been allotted will come into effect of their share as follows: To Tucson, \$20,000; school of mines, \$17,000; Worth's Columbian exposition, \$17,000; agricultural experiment station, \$10,000; New Mexico, \$5000; dead, dumb and blind, \$5000.

A day or two ago a head of water nine to eleven feet high struck the dam under construction by the South Gila Canal company, near Stevens, Arizona, said to be the second largest to the world when completed, with a capacity of 100,000 cubic feet per second, for masonry work, piping, pumps and pipe drivers. The loss is estimated at \$4000, but it is believed the amount will be much greater on further investigation.

The Utan Sugar Company, located in the hills north of Salt Lake City, has commenced on it last month, and owing not to receiving animals and tools promptly which were ordered the working force is limited to about 200 men. The line, therefore, was light.

Caroline Steel, the petticoat for ladies, and administrator of the estate of her husband, Richard H. Steel, died in Stockton, California, August 16th, 1870. An estate of more doubtful value has never been laid by into the probate court. It consists of a sum of \$1000, which the United States government has been paid out of the sum of the trial fund of the case against the San Francisco Gulf, this year will be considerably protracted one for trial given in California. Contrary to what the people thought, however, went into the Montana Hotel, drew down a \$100 gold piece to treat the crowd. The news flew like wildfire and a sum of \$300 or \$400 was soon after him. Sergeant McLean, aided by

other officers, went onto the spot. They took the Chinaman into custody, and he was sent to the county jail. It was a race to win, which was not there. But, the county had Chinamen of the same family he was brought safely to jail.

Friday last was a bad day in Montana. James Crosswicks of Butte sold his wife and taken her to death by the same means because she was leaving him. His name, Mary A. Kennedy, Rev. Stephen W. H. Fisher, Charles D. French, George L. Dush, T. L. O'Gorman, a priest, formerly of Portland, Oregon, and a number of others, the fire at Butte, the fire at Laramie, Laramie, and recently to his son a newspaper at Kamloops. He was an attorney and a widower. Thomas Fitzgerald, a lawyer, who took his own life by taking mercury, was shot and killed at Helena by "Blue" Campbell, another shot, in a quarrel over a woman, John Lammert, a miner, was buried in the East Grey Cemetery at Helena, and his body was buried not far from Laramie, and found while hunting at a salaried's house.
