BY TELEGRAPH.

BERLIN, 9.—A fresh difficulty in the way of peace has arisen in Turkey: the Christian subjects of the Sultan have hitherto been exempt from military duty, and they now refuse to continue to pay the exemption tax, and offer, instead, to give their military services. The Christians justify their action on the promise contained in the Sultan's edict of full and perfect equality with the Mahomedans. The Sublime Porte refuses to accept, on the ground that Christians are not to be trusted in his army.

The Prussian *Cross Gazette* announces that the petition of Armin's family to the Emperor for the Count's pardon has been refused.

PARIS, 9.—Specie in the Bank of France increased 27,705,000 francs the past week.

The French ministry has been definitely constituted as follows—M. Dufaure, vice-president of the council and minister of justice; M. Ricard, interior; M. Waddington, public instruction and worship; M. Christophe, public works; M. Teisserenc de Dort, agriculture and commerce; M. Leon Say, finance; General De Cissy, war; Duc de Cases, foreign affairs. All the members of the new cabinet belong to the Left Centre. The ministry will communicate with the Chambers to-morrow, either by a written programme, or through a speech by M. Dufaure.

The Bois de Boulogne and the Isle St. Germain are partially submerged.

BOMBAY, 11.—The *Serapis*, with the Prince of Wales and suite, has sailed from here for England; after calling at Malta, where a series of grand receptions has been arranged, and also at Lisbon, the Prince of Wales will go direct for Portsmouth, reaching there about the 20th of April.

—It is said that five of the States have abolished the gallows.
