## THE CORONER'S INQUIRY.

Being Held Over the Remains of the Harbor who was shot at Sandy Yester.

Copier Harris was at 3 o'clock this afternoon holding an inquest over the remains of J. A. Gier (John Howey, as heretofore reported) the unfortunate harbor, who was shot and killed at Sandy yesterday morning by Ex-Confederate Lewis, as published in last evening's News.

Lewis is now in the county jail awaiting arraignment. At the inquest he was represented by Powers & Hills, while Assistant County Attorney Elmer appeared for the people.

The names were George W. Williams, Benjamin Nunn and W. H. Scott.

The testimony was that the three had eaten the body of the dead man between the abdomen and breast.

Lewis defended his action by saying that Gier had threatened his life on several occasions, and that on the day before yesterday morning, he threw his hand towards his hip pocket as he was about to draw his gun. This move, Lewis concluded, dangerously drew his own pistol, and he fired five shots, three of which took effect.

The result of the inquest had not been announced when the News went to press.
