AMERICAN CAPITAL CHAT.
A Batch of News from Washington.

WASHINGTON, 31.—Attorney General Devens is on his way to Canton, Ohio, to attend a soldiers' reunion to-morrow. At Muncie, Ind., he will deliver his first political address on September 3d. He also speaks at Indianapolis on the 4th, and at South Bend on the 6th. He will visit the Minnesota State Fair, at Minneapolis, on the 8th, and expects to return to Washington on the 12th.

A dispatch from Col. Meacham, of the Utah Commission, dated Los Angeles, 29th, states: "The crisis in the Utah affairs has passed. Seventy Uncompahgre and White River head men and chiefs have placed their hands under the direction of an agent. They have accepted Sagaveneri as chief, have agreed to preserve our property intact and to proceed immediately to complete the reorganization and enrollment. You need have no fears. Agent Berry is equal to the emergency and has the confidence of the Utes at Los Pinos and White River. They are anxious for peace."

The first and second volumes of the official records of the late war are in the hands of the printers. The transportation of mails was ordered recently over the completed portion of the Southern Pacific Railroad, from Yuma, Arizona, to Benson, Arizona, nearly 300 miles. This completes a continuous route of mail transportation by rail from San Francisco through the entire length of California and nearly across the southern portion of Arizona, a distance of over 1,000 miles. The transportation of mails over the Arizona end of the route begins on September 20, and will be the first railroad mail service ever performed in that Territory.

Acting Secretary Bell, of the Interior Department, received a dispatch this evening from Mr. Money, chairman of the Ute Commission, dated Southern Ute Agency, August 24th, which confirms the published report of Chief Ouray's death. Up to the time of the receipt of this telegram, which will be observed was six days on the way, Bell was inclined to discredit the report of Ouray's death. The dispatch says: "Ouray died this morning. The Commission fear this may embarras them in their work. Held a high council yesterday, but no Indians signed the agreement. Ignato and other chiefs opposed it."

Chicago, 31.—The Inter-Oceanic special says: The republican congressional committee are sending out documents at the rate of 300,000 per day. There is a demand for campaign literature never before known. There is going through the press to-day a document that after it has done its work as a campaign document, will take a place among our works of literature. It is a handsome twenty-four page pamphlet, entitled "Garfield's Claims," and contains a summary of his life and all his speeches on various topics under appropriate classifications. A specimen is the saying, "A pound of pluck is worth a ton of luck." The first edition will be 100,000 copies.

The Inter-Oceanic reports the return of the Chicago Clearing House for August, at \$137,000,000 against \$90,000,000 for the corresponding month last year. This shows an increase of 42 per cent. The clearings for the first eight months of the year are reported \$1,053,000,000, against \$728,000,000 for the corresponding period in 1879, showing an increase of 43 per cent.

Exploded Boiler.
CLEVELAND, 31.—A boiler weighing 1,000 pounds, in the National Oil Works on Canal Street, exploded this afternoon and was blown 500 yards, in its flight breaking two large telegraph poles and demolishing the Factory Street bridge over the canal. Two men and a boy were injured. Eugene Welch, a blacksmith, was fatally hurt. The cause of the explosion is unknown.

Hayes in Cleveland.

A Divine Revue.
