## AFFAIRS OF WEBER COUNTY.

**Official Bonds Filed—Movement For Another Agricultural Experiment Station.**

## THE CITY SOLONS IN SESSION.

**Kitchen Range Explodes, Narrow Escape of Mrs. J. H. Hall—Weddings—News Briefs.**

The board of county commissioners received a communication from A. W. Casey of Salt Lake City, in which he stated that it has been decided, by whom it is not stated, that the commission to be chosen to select the site and prepare the bill for the establishment of another experiment station shall consist of a member from Salt Lake, Juab, Davis and Weber counties, and he asked that the board appoint a representative from this county to act on the commission. The matter was referred to Commissioner Stanford to consider and report. As such a commission cannot be appointed except authorized by act of the Legislature, and as such appointments are usually made by the governor of the state, it is not likely that action will be taken on the petition.

The board ordered the county clerk to notify the county treasurer that \$1,637.50 has been ordered set aside for the payment of the county superintendent of schools, salary, and other expenses in that office during the school year of 1904-5.

County Treasurer Alma D. Chambers filed his official bond of \$150,000, with David Eccles, Thomas D. Fox, George H. Rife, Adam Patterson, Joseph Clark and W. W. Rife as his bondsmen. The official bond of Sheriff Joseph W. Bailey was also filed and accepted, and a number of the justices of the peace submitted their bonds.

Chairman Stanford reported having received two car loads of coal from the Utah Coal company, which was distributed among the needy of the city.

A number of other routine matters were disposed of, and the board adjourned for one week.

## CITY COUNCIL SESSION.

At its meeting last night the city council unanimously adopted the nomination made by the mayor of John D. Murphy as judge of the police court of Ogden city for the next 12 months, in place of Judge Howell, who resigned his office and seat on the bench of the district court.

Mayor Glassman sent in a number of vetoes, some of which the council set aside, while others were taken under advisement. The first veto was that of the street cleaning company, the mayor disapproving of it on the ground that the names of the members of the company did not appear in the ordinance. The council inserted the name of Rudolph Kachner and passed the ordinance. Another veto was the disapproving of the resolution passed a week ago appropriating \$100 for the improvement of sidewalks in the fourth ward. Councilman Williams explained that the money had already been spent and the action of the council was sustained. The mayor also disapproved of the sale of a piece of land located just north of the Ogden river bridge to Mr. Watts for \$50. The council decided to take a week to consider this veto. The mayor also sent in a veto of the council's previous action providing that the street supervisor make an estimate of the cost of repairing the sidewalks and the cost of repairs during the construction of the sewer. The street committee explained that it was the intention to deduct the amount necessary for such repairs from the sum paid to the sewer contractor, and he paid to the sewer contractor, and the resolution was passed over the mayor's veto.

On recommendation of the law committee the sum of \$100 was appropriated to each councilman as extra pay for services rendered while sitting on boards of equalization and the like.

A petition was received signed by the bricklayers, stonemasons and hodcarriers asking that the council extend the area within which the erection of frame buildings will not be permitted. The petition was referred to the fire committee.

## PLEASANT GROVE.

JOHN S. GLEASON DEAD.

One of Original Utah Pioneers and Navaho Veterans.

Pleasant Grove, Utah Co., Dec. 28.—John S. Gleason, another of our honored pioneers, passed away Wednesday morning, Jan. 12, 1819, in the town of Pleasant Grove, New York. He was baptized into the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints June 21, 1833. About this time he was working for a farmer named Isaac Chase, whose daughter, Desdemona, he married on the 8th day of November, 1839. His wife resided with his parents, while he filed a mission to preach the Gospel in the Eastern States and in Canada, where he remained during the year 1840 and a portion of 1841. Returning home, he immediately prepared to move with his wife and her father's family to Nauvoo, Ill., where "Mormon" people had gathered after their expulsion from Missouri. He worked his father-in-law's farm in 1842, and in 1843 went on a mission to the Eastern States, returning to Nauvoo in the spring of 1844.

The Nauvoo Legion was organized and he was appointed major of the East battalion, First regiment, First cohort, which office he held until the Legion was disbanded. He was personally acquainted with the Prophet Joseph Smith, and took an active part in the stirring events which transpired preceding and following the death of the Prophet.

His was one of the first families to leave Nauvoo and cross the Mississippi river, and he was now in Perryville, Missouri, across the river from the Illinois city. The following winter, 1846-7, he was in the army.
