These certificates will be supplied to the society members on the payment of \$1 each. The money thus provided will be used in the preparation of county exhibits. The intention is to interest every citizen in the World's Fair work. The payment of the membership fee of \$1 constitutes membership in the society association.

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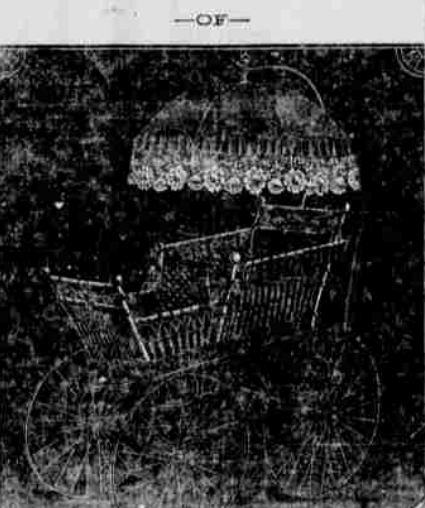
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
