CONFERENCES AT PETERHOF ON THE AGRARIAN QUESTION.

St. Petersburg, Aug. 23.—An import-ant series of conferences began last night at Peterhof on the question of immediate distribution of the crown lands and appenages to the peasants, in an attempt to find a partial solution of the agrarian question by measurbly appeasing the land hunger of the peasantry, and the Associated Press is now in a position to announce that the government has definitely decided to proceed with the original plan outlined in these dispatches Aug. 7, for settling the agrarian question, regardless of parliament, and go to the coun-try upon the issue at the coming elec-The Associated Press was informed this afternoon by a member of the cabinet who participated in the Peterhof conference that the agrarian question is no longer open. Within a fortnight an imperial ukase will be issued directing the agrarian commission to begin the distribution of 1,800,000 dessiatines (a dessiatine is about two and a half acres) belonging to the appanages, four million dessiatines be longing to the crown, and two million dessiatines of land offered to or purchased through the Peasants' bank. Only the forests and lands belonging to the state, the preservation of which is considered necessary for the future agricultural prosperity of the country, will be reserved. The transaction will be financed through the Peasants' bank.
