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TERRIBLE ACCIDENT.

A Boy Bathed and Got Off By Railroad Cars.

A shocking accident occurred here on Saturday about noon. Joseph, a fourteen-year-old son of John T. O'Connell, a merchant of this place, fell from the cars and was run over.

A few days ago Mr. O'Connell sold a fine motor car to a man who he believed was a reliable driver.

The car was driven to the house of the boy, and the boy was permitted to accompany David Rice, city marshal, down to the depot to try and identify, if possible, the thief.

Joseph, terrified, stood aloof and his companion, who climbed up on the platform of a car.

The south-bound passenger train was due at the depot at that time, and the boy, seeing that he was in a bad way, jumped from the car and ran to the street.

He was running very fast and his feet were slipping on the wet pavement.

He fell and was run over by the car, and he was killed.

The car was stopped and the driver was taken to the hospital.

The car was damaged and the driver was injured.

There were present of the Stake Presidency, Pres. T. E. Hicks and Jas. L. Steele, also several of the Bishops and other leading people.
