



SIX DAY RACE AT SALT PALACE.

The first named four were still on the track fighting it out among themselves at the end of the hour.

Johnnie Fisher, the boy from Chicago, was the winner last night. At the end of the 60-minute grand, he crossed the tape first with a burst of speed that left the others behind. He had a hard fight for the lead, but he won it. He was followed by Downing, Samuelson, and Staver.

This big event is a lap race and every contestant jumped out at the start. He stuck to the others for about 15 miles before he made the attempt, but when he did win a lap, and then a second, and then a third, the crowd yelled with delight and he was the recipient of cheers galore. Then old "Buddy" Staver took a chance at the game and he, too, managed to get a few laps to his credit and also great applause.

Before the professionals started out on their grand old hour, the amateurs participated in an interesting program arranged for them by manager Schiefel.

Staver and Aaron put up a fierce struggle for the honors in the five-mile lap race, the result being as follows: Aaron first, Staver second, and then the boys.
