FRANCE. Increase of Bullion-Centennial

One-Third in Money and Two-Thirds

PARIS, 20.—The specie in the Bank of France has increased six-teen million francs the past week. Two commissioners, to represent France at the Philadelphia Centennial, one to reside in the U.S., and one in France, will be appointed.

The Electoral Period.

MADRID, 19.—A decree has been promulgated, declaring the electo-ral period opened; during the time prescribed the press is free to dis-cuss all constitutional questions except that of the monarchy, and public meetings of a political char-acter may be held. The decree concludes by expressing the hopes of the government for the re-establishment of a representative re-gime, without which there can be nothing but anarchy.
