These Wagons are designed especially for the Utah and Montana trade, with many important improvements which experience has taught us are required for this section.

They are made of the toughest Oak, Ash and Hickory that the forests of Ohio, Michigan and Wisconsin can furnish.

This timber is thoroughly seasoned, being kept from three to five years in open sheds. The Hubs are then subjected to a degree of heat sufficient to make them perfectly dry, without injuring the felloe or stave.

The Hubs are of Black Locust, and warranted not to check.

The Felloes are soaked in boiling oil before being painted, and will not shrink.

The entire wood work of these wagons is seasoned, so as to stand the severe test of this peculiar dry climate.

They have clips around front Axle for the round brace, and stay chains instead of a bolt through the Axle. The Tires are fastened with the famous double-headed California Rivet. On all medium and heavy Wagons the tire is one-eighth inch thicker on hind than forward wheel.

They are the best proportioned and best ironed Wagon that ever crossed the Missouri river. We challenge comparison on each of these points.

The bottoms of Boxes have double cleats in the center, secured by double straps that hook over the top, instead of being simply riveted to the sides of the box.

Both lower and top boxes are ironed on top. We use a Patent Thimble Skeln of our own make, set by a Patent Axle Gauge, which secures perfect uniformity, and makes the Lightest Draft Wagon that can be made.

We use the Patent Bent Round on the smallest sizes.

We have no hesitation in saying that our California Brake is the very best. We have patented an improvement by which they can be used without the box being on the Wagon. N. B.—This improvement can be used by no other manufacturer.

The B listers are iron plated, and there are corresponding plates on the edges of the box. They have our Patent Socket for King Bolt (found on no other wagon), which leaves a smooth surface for the bottom of the box, and prevents the king bolt from we ring into the bolster.

"We warrant the Wagon No. of our manufacture, to be of good seasoned timber, and well made. Any breakage within one year, resulting from defect either in material or workmanship, we agree to make good without cost to the purchaser."

AUDITOR'S WARRANTS.

SEC. 3 Of an Act approved February 15, 1872, reads as follows:

"The Auditor of Public Accounts is hereby authorized and required to call in all outstanding Auditor's Warrants, on or before the first day of August, A. D., eighteen hundred and seventy-two, and to issue therefor warrants under his official seal. He shall publish a notice in one or more newspapers having general circulation in this Territory, stating that such warrants are required to be exchanged."

All persons holding Auditor's Warrants not having thereon the Impress of the Auditor's official seal, will please forward them to this office immediately to be exchanged in pursuance of the above section. New warrants with official seal attached, will be issued promptly to replace those so forwarded, and returned to the owners by mail or otherwise at their risk. Tax collectors of the several counties are authorized to receive Auditor's warrants on taxes due the Territory until the 1st of August next, although said warrants may not have the official seal attached, but it is expected they will forward them to the Territorial Treasurer with as little delay as possible. Persons holding Auditor's Warrants, not having the Auditor's official seal attached, after the 1st of August, 1872, will do so at their own risk.
