Army Officers Dismissed.

LONDON, Oct. 20.—As a result of the investigation into the recent trouble in "C" regiment, First regiment of the Life Guards, the authorities have dismissed from the service eight non-commissioned officers. One private has already been sentenced to confinement to confinement to disciplinary imprisonment, and has been dismissed from the service, while the sergeant who has charge of the company has been removed from his stewardship.

Joint Seal Cards.

OTTAWA, Ont., Oct. 20.—The secretary of the Society's Association of British Columbia, telegraphs today that it is estimated that the total value of British Columbia's salmon catch will be about \$1,000,000, which, as compared with the catch of last year, shows a falling off of fifteen per cent. The average price of salmon is placed at \$1 per lb. against an average of \$1.25 last year, which will cause a reduction of something in the neighborhood of thirty-five per cent. in the aggregate value of the total catch of this year. With the exception of the salmon Maggie McCall all of the smaller fish have returned to British Columbia. The salmon is believed to have been lost at sea.

Democratic Meeting.

NEW HAVEN, Conn., Oct. 20.—Secretary of the Treasury Fairchild spoke to a large audience at the democratic rally here tonight, dwelling at great length upon the financial condition of the country, and concluding by declaring that President Cleveland was not an advocate of the unrestricted coinage of silver, and that the present situation was modeled after the ideas advanced by Cleveland during his administration.

BALTIMORE, Md., Oct. 20.—Ex-secretary of the state laymen addressed an enthusiastic democratic meeting here today. He depicted his time principally in the McKinley bill from a democratic stand-point, the few bills introduced.

GALVESTON, Texas, Oct. 20.—The latest developments in the Santa Fe operators' strike is an agreement that the operators resume work immediately pending a conference between the Texas committee and President Mann.

Vessels Captured.

SAN SEBASTIAN, Spain, Oct. 20.—During a heavy gale last night two small floating vessels were captured off port and ten persons drowned. Details from various places on the coast state that many small vessels were wrecked and a number of lives lost.

Gladstone's Eyesight.

LONDON, Oct. 19.—Mr. Gladstone consulted Dr. Granger, the oculist, a few days ago on account of the condition of his eyesight, which has remained poor since his removal to Scotland. It will be remembered that during the general election in last July Mr. Gladstone was hit in the eye by a missile thrown by a woman. Although the effects of the injury seemed to have disappeared in a few days, it was believed that the woman had severely damaged Mr. Gladstone because he alarmed over the increasing weakness of his sight that he was easily persuaded to consult the oculist. Dr. Granger, after a careful examination, reported that he could detect only the slightest trace of a slight degree of blindness of the injured eye, and assured Mr. Gladstone that he would retain good sight for many years to come. The doctor also declared that Mr. Gladstone was in excellent health.
