**More Marine Disasters—The Daily Accident.**

New York, Oct. 21.—An Antwerp special telegraph from the Norwegian bark *Bravo* just arrived from Charleston, reports on the 20th that in latitude 38, longitude 42 west, she picked up Captain Cunha, and Captain Cunha's wife, two sailors and sixteen passengers of the American schooner *Carrie W. Clark*. The *Clark* was bound from Fayal to Boston and she put under way on the 17th and after terrible laboring, caused by a tremendous sea, the fore-mast had to be cut away. A few moments afterwards a

and a gust of wind struck the vessel and the main mast went by the board. The remainder of the passengers were brought by the *Bravo* is that while the captain thought it best to desert her crew, the passengers were a number of thirty-six, remained aboard refusing to leave her, depending on what was said of the passengers to rig a sail and bring the vessel safely into port.

New York, Oct. 21.—Advices to the Associated Press indicate that a severe easterly gale accompanied by rain was blowing from the North Atlantic coast from North Carolina to Massachusetts and elsewhere by shipping are feared along the New England coast. The *Allegany* is not affected by pre-broke, but the cargo is. Will consider the loss of money and nothing but heavy westerly gales can injure her. The gale is moderating and there are no more chances of a strong water strong northwest. The Captain of the Chatham Life Saving Station is by the way.
