the fourteenth amendment to the consti-
tution.

Horace Greeley's life was insured for
\$100,000 for the benefit of the Friends
association. It is announced that the
Caspua home of Mr. Greeley
will be abandoned by the family, and
that the property will be auctioned
immediately.

The twenty years' litigation for the
possession of Jackson Hollow, the famous
ranch locality in Brooklyn, is ended by the decision of the Court of
Appeals in favor of the purchase under
the execution sale, and against the
survivors of the Jackson family.

The property is valued at \$300,000, and
was insured for \$80,000.
