The Constitution of this land guarantees to all life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness and we are controlled and regulated only by the laws made by the duly accredited representatives of the people. Your body does not represent government, nor order, and you have no authority to 'hereby summon" any one, by any right whatsoever, unless it he by the red flag of anarchy, and by that treason of which you yourselves are guilty, in thus arrogating to yourselves the laws of God, and of your country, in a criminal attempt, by threats and high-sounding phrases, to deprive a few men of the right to mind their own business. You say "God Almighty made hell for traitors." This is correct, and while you are warning others, be careful of yourselves, for if ever a crude composition bore the imprint of his saturic majesty's press, your circular does.

"Treason;" just why you attempt to apply this word to those who are faithful to their trusts, while your small clique are the ones who have actusily undertaken a rebellion, is a mystery, except that perhaps in your "lost g to be loyal to their employers.

Then there is that other word which you use, "Deserter," The definition which is "one who leaves his position, his party, or his friends, particularly a soldier or seaman, who quits zervice without permission and in violation of his agreement." This is exactly your predicament. You have forsaken your position and quit the service without permission, and in violation of your obligations. If we operators now at work were in a similar posttion, and had received a summons from the company to answer such a charge, we would without doubt appear before the proper officers with an appeal for forgiveness. Their operating expenses were \$1.588.271, or \$146.275.112 more than in 1965. The net carmings aggregated \$788.887.886. The net carnings aggregated \$788,887,896, we herease of \$97,007,692. The net earn-bugs per mile of line averaged \$3,548. The line-me attributable to other

mouries than operating is reported at \$155,639,541.

Deducting fixed and other charges, the report says \$157,186,328 is the not income for the year available for dividends or surplus. There were \$77,707,328 passeengers marked, an increase of every 5,000,000, and 1,641,219,219 tons of freight carried, an increase of over 207,000,000. The average revenue per passenger per tain only increased hoth for passenger reals only increased hoth for passenger and freight trains, and the average cost of running a train one mile increased. The ratio of operation expenses to earning was over 66 per cent.
