ITALIAN LOSES ENTIRE FAMILY.

One of the most pitiable cases brought to the attention of the people of Ogden in a number of months is that of an Italian laborer, named H. Tedes, who has arrived in Ogden from Nevada and has learned that his wife, two sons, a sister and two brothers, had perished in the Italian earthquake which completely devastated the city of Palmoli.

Immediately after the report of the great disaster had reached Tedes in one of the railroad construction camps where he was working, he immediately set out for Ogden to see Vice Consul Frazzini and learn if possible whether his relatives had escaped the calamity. The most reliable news from the stricken center in the city of Palmoli was to the effect that the entire city of Palmoli was inundated by a tidal wave and all its inhabitants lost.

When the unfortunate man was informed of the total loss of his family, it was thought at first for a time that he would go insane, but with the kind and faithful care of friends he recovered and is now making preparations to go to Italy.

ESCAPE FROM STATE SCHOOL.

Two inmates of the State Industrial school made their escape this forenoon. Their names are Ralph and John Gordon, brothers, who were sent up from Salt Lake. After breakfast and just before school began they hid themselves under a table in the kitchen. Up to noon they had not been apprehended.

Mrs. Isabelle Larson, wife of Israel Larson, died this morning at the family residence on East Seventh street, as the result of blood poisoning. Deceased was born in Ogden 25 years ago, and had been married two years. She is survived by her husband and infant child. Her death was a peculiarly sad one, and was due to peculiar circumstances. Some time ago she went to a dentist to have some teeth drawn, and it is presumed the instruments were affected with the germs of disease, for blood poisoning set in and nothing could be done to save her.
