

Lake Michigan, but none very serious. The Board of Trade, after one day's notice, subscribed over \$2,000 for the Michigan fire sufferers. The lumberman's Association have sent \$1,000, and many individuals sent money and articles needed.

KANSAS CITY, 12.—Geo. Bannister, for disturbing a church meeting near the scene of the recent train robbery, by flourishing a revolver, firing it and hurrahing for the robbers, was arrested to-day, and from his action it is believed he has given himself away, and will probably be held as a participant in the robbery. No other developments. The grand jury will sit next Monday. The exposition opened to-day.

SAN FRANCISCO, 13.—A Tucson dispatch says: A mass meeting, completely filling the largest hall in the city, was held to-night to discuss and take action on the Indian question. Mayor Carr presided. The unanimous sentiment of the meeting was in favor of urging the government to remove the Apaches to Indian Territory, and in the meantime, if necessary, to organize for territorial protection. A committee was appointed to draft resolutions and report to-morrow night.

News from Fort Thomas to-night says: The White Mountain Indians have gained control of a canyon commanding Fort Apache; should this be true, in spite of Gen. Willcox's active and energetic movements, the situation was undoubtedly serious.

At a meeting to-night were many prospectors and mining men, who all stated that the idea of a concerted movement among the Indians was positive and beyond doubt, and that other Apaches would surely join the White Mountain band. The situation in the past 24 hours has assumed several very serious phases. It is believed that Gen. Fremont will convene the legislature in extra session upon his arrival.

PROVIDENCE, 13.—Gen. A. E. Burnside died, to-day, suddenly at 9 o'clock this morning, at his residence in Bristol. He had been slightly unwell for two or three days, but was in the city last evening. The immediate cause of death was spasms of the heart. A telephone message from the General's house summoned Senator Anthony and Dr. Miller, but before the telephonic connection was broken a message came that the General was dead. Governor Littlefield, Senator Anthony and Representative Chase and other personal friends immediately started for Bristol.

ST. PAUL, 13., Eleven o'clock.—The balloon is just heard from, anchored in the woods four miles from St. Paul, waiting for winds. The aeronaut and journalists are domiciled at the house of a farmer near by. The gas is escaping and the prospect of a long voyage dubious.

#### FOREIGN.

GOLETTA, 12.—A native messenger proceeding to the French camp at Seaghorn returned. He reports that he met a small body of French troops fleeing before a large force of Arabs and saw several French soldiers killed.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Sept. 12.—An English sailing vessel has been attacked and pillaged by pirates near the Island of Samoa.

ST. JOHNS, Sept. 12.—The steamer Proteus has arrived from Lady Franklin Bay, having accomplished her work. She brought back members of the expedition party regarded as unfit to endure the hardships of the Arctic winter. There is much ice in Lady Franklin Bay. No tidings of the missing Jeannette or the search parties.

TORONTO, 12.—There has been great damage by fires in the neighborhood of Owen Sound, Parry Sound, Gravenhurst, Otterville, Stratford, Eden Mills, Burton and Saurahere. A million dollars' worth of timber has been burned in Parry Sound district.

LONDON, Ont., 12.—Cattle are reported dying on all sides on account of drouth.

LONDON, 12.—The Assistant Inspector-General of Irish Constabulary arrived in Limerick and has taken charge of the town until Thursday, in connection with recent disturbances there. The greatest excitement prevails.

DUBLIN, 12.—At a meeting at Kiltullagh, Galway, Larkin, of the New York Irish World, made a violent speech, in which he declared that Irishmen should not pay rent except at the point of the bayonet or mouth of the cannon. The land bill he said was a fraud.

ROME, 12.—The *Italic* says: The Czar has joined the Austro-German alliance, an event which will produce important consequences, who ought to congratulate herself upon it, as it constitutes a fresh guarantee of European peace.

CORK, 12.—A party of disguised men broke into a house belonging to three brothers named Mahony near Knocknagore and shot them, probably fatally.

LONDON 12.—In the Trades Union Congress to-day a resolution was passed execrating Guiteau's crime, and sympathizing with the President's family and the American people.
