A London medical magazine re-commends the following plan for packing apples to prevent spolling from the fermentation that arises from bruising the fruit. By this means apples may be shipped to long distances by land or sea with-eut the great damage which usually occurs: "A common but soft kind of tissue paper should envelop each apple before it is placed in the cask, and this tissue paper should have been soaked in a solution of salicytic acid and dried before it is used.
