THEATRICAL.—We expected to see a larger house on the occasion of Mr. McCullough's farewell appearance yesterday evening. His scholarly rendition of the melancholy Dane is already well known here and needs no further comments from our hands. It is a finished impersonation. Of Madame Scheller's exquisite delineation of Ophelia we have also spoken on several occasions. To Mr. McCullough we owe many a pleasant evening, and we wish him a pleasant journey across the Sierra Nevada to the golden shores of the Pacific.

To-night we have a programme which promises humor, fun and mirth for everybody. Madame Scheller will commence a series of three light and amusing entertainments, which have rendered her engagements so popular with our people.
