> Cheap Smoke House. Such readers as have posuch con-

for fear of thorns.

Such readers as have no such convenience as a regularly constructed smoke house may supply the deficiency in the following manner: dig a narrow pit twaire inches deep, throwing the earth all out on one side. From near the bottom of this pit dig a trench of the length of one or two joints of story pipe at such an angle as will bring the end away from the pit to the surface of the ground. Over the end of this pipe set a commen flour barret or large cask, as may be needed, and having removed both heads, bank up all around it with the loose earth, so that no smoke can escape at the bottom. Hang in the hams, shoulders, etc., using something like a broom handle to run through venience as a regularly constructed smoke house may supply the defi-ciency in the following manner: dig a narrow pit twelve inches deep, throwing the earth all out on like a broom handle to run through the strings. Putting a cover on top of the sticks will leave space enough for draught, to let the smoke pass freely. Build a smoke fire of corncobs, damp hard wood, sawdust or fine chips, and you will have a cheap, safe, and efficient smoke-house with very little trouble—Moore's Rural.


