RESPONSIBLE TO GOD ALONE.

We have our agency in these matters,
but the author of our being will hold us
responsible for the actions com-
mitted here on this planet. "He that
obeys the Gospel of Jesus Christ shall
be saved." It is only a part of the decree
of an All-wise Creator. "The remainder,"
in this: "He that believeth not shall
be damned." It is as necessary to
heed the latter proclamation as the
former, as by our unbelief we are
damned, or cut short of blessings, be-
cause without belief there is nothing to
incite us to action. Thus our pro-
gress is stopped by unbelief.

Conference was dismissed by Elder
S. H. Head.

At 2 p. m. conference was again
called to order. Elder Corroll was the
first speaker. His remarks were con-
fined to the importance of the Saints
obeying the Word of Wisdom as given
through the Prophet Joseph Smith.

Elder Houston, the next speaker,
quoted 2 John, verse 19, "Whosoever
transgresseth, and abideth not in the
doctrine of Christ, hath not God." Said
there is but one Gospel, and that
the power of God unto salvation to
every one that will submit to the laws
and ordinances therein contained.

The speaker referred to the testi-
monies which had been borne by the Elders
that had spoken previously, and asked
the hearers to prayerfully consider
them and what had been spoken.

Elder Wright of the West Tennessee
Conference, being present by invitation,
said it was a pleasure to him to
meet the elders and a few of the Saints
of East Tennessee. He read from
Luke 23rd chapter, where

TOOK PLACE BETWEEN JESUS CHRIST AND
THE LAMB OF GOD. As the promise,
"today shall thou be with me in para-
dise," made by Jesus while on the
cross to one of the malefactors, affords
so much happiness to a class of bap-
tized deniers. The speaker dwelt on
that point for some time, proving the
fallacy of the belief that the thief went
straight to heaven.

President Morgan was the last
speaker. He said this was an im-
portant day. Said the effects
of habits contracted here
will follow us beyond the grave, and
less repeated of. When death seizes
the spirit and body separate, the form-
er goes to the land of spirits, while the
latter decomposes and returns to the
mother earth. But while the body
here, and the spirit in the land of spirits,
it cannot be tempted. The man may
have been a thief, and yet the
body would not steal; or a drunkard
and now the liquor that would have
been so tempting during the time
the spirit inhabited the mortal part,
is rejected. Thus we can see that
it is the spirit-immortal part-
of the drunkard that craves the drink.
What we are here we shall be here-
after, unless a reformation takes
place; therefore it is very necessary
that evils should be corrected here.

Benediction by Elder Heber K. Perkins.

Sunday, October 9th.-Promptly at
10 a. m. conference convened. Pres-
ident Perkins was the first speaker.
He said the Spirit of God is not man-
ifested in contention but in peace,
longsuffering and gentleness; there-
fore the Elders have not come here to
rob you of your rights and liberties,
but to unfold, in a God-fearing man-
ner, the principles of the Gospel of
Christ. The speaker's words were re-
plete with the spirit of "peace and
good will towards men."

Elder Daybell followed on the in-
consistency of

President Morgan then addressed the
congregation. He prefaced his dis-

CONFERENCE IN TENNESSEE.
Joyful Re-union of Saints and Mis-
sionaries.

Editor Deseret News:

On Saturday and Sunday, October
25th and 26th, the Elders of this, the
East Tennessee Conference, held their
annual two-days' meeting at the above
place, in the Saints' meeting-house;
and, as the event was truly an enjoy-
able one for the Elders and Saints, I

On Saturday at 10 a. m. meeting was
called to order, and after singing a
hymn, prayer, and offering by Elder
W. Barnes, singing "Joy to the World,"
the conference proceeded to business.
In meeting all the elders of this confer-
ence, expressing his pleasure, and
explained in regard to the duties of
those assembled, and extended to all
a hearty welcome.

Elder Cameron followed on the im-
portance of believing in and practicing
the same principles as were practiced
by Jesus and His apostles. Said nothing
of short of obedience to the same
would save mankind in the house.

ETERNAL WORLD.
Quotations from the Bible were given
proving his assertions.

Elder Blunt, the next speaker, dwelt
for some length of time upon the great
necessity of the Saints watching
themselves, small offenses. The
speaker made use of the illustration
that an adopted in masonry would
be building a house, and the smaller
ones, which would be carefully he-
wed, and placed in the structure with skill.
If these were not put together, they
would form a large and beautiful
dwelling, so also will mankind if not
checked they grow into a mountain of
sin, which, in time, will completely
wreck the individual. Where there is

do not permit it to govern you. Prayer
is the most potent agent we can em-
ploy in shaping ourselves into a life

Elder J. W. HATCH

are eternal and unchangeable and they

but by the Spirit of God?" And
in order to obtain the Holy Ghost,
