OBITUARY.

Died in Salt Lake City, July 3rd, 1877, after a lingering illness, of liver complaint, Mrs. ANN EDMUNDS, daughter of Jonathan and Amy Brunning, and wife of Francis Edmunds, of this city.

Deceased was born in Wangford, Suffolk County, England, July 29, 1822; embraced the gospel in May, 1849, and emigrated to Utah in 1858, where she has lived the life of a true Saint. She was the mother of thirteen children, eight of whom are still living, and eight grandchildren. She has filled faithfully, for a number of years, the office of teacher in the branch of the Relief Society of the Tenth Ward, and her kind words of counsel and ministering hand will be sadly missed by those with whom she associated. Though great the bereavement in consigning her to the silent grave, we have the assurance that her good works will live after her. M. P.

Died, in Harrisville Ward, Weber County, Utah, on Tuesday morning, June 12th, 1877, of heart disease, MARGARET PARKINSON, wife of Richard Daniels Brown. She was born May 12th, 1811, at Lamberhead Green, near Wigan, Lancashire, England; married Sept. 30th, 1830, at Hindley Church, near Wigan. She embraced the gospel in the Manchester Conference, England, June 9th, 1850.

She was the mother of seventeen children, the first five dying in infancy, and two subsequently. The ten surviving ones have all come to these valleys, and there are fifty-seven grandchildren. Her love for her children is known by her severe ex-

posures and ardent toil for their comfort in the midst of her impoverished surroundings, and her sacrifices are indelibly stamped with her love and fidelity to her holy religion. Her dear has always been opened for the reception of God's saints and servants; and at six different times she aided her children to go from her parental care to gather to Zion. In the fall of 1864 her longing desires were gratified by gathering with her husband and remaining little ones to the bosom of the church. In the fall of 1865 they settled in Harrisville, and in April 17, 1868, she joined and was set apart as a teacher of the Relief Society organization of this place.

She was in the enjoyment of moderate health to the day of her death, which was very sudden. Her youngest son going to her room at quarter past six o'clock a.m., to ascertain the reason she did not arise as usual, found her dead in bed, her husband being on a visit to his daughter in Cache Valley at the time.

She died as though she was enwrapped in balmy sleep, and without an apparent struggle; thus passed off a faithful Saint, a loving wife and an affectionate mother, to sleep in Christ, to await the morning of the first resurrection.

The funeral services were held on Thursday, June 14th, 1877. The Bishop, his counselors and a large concourse of relatives and friends were assembled at her funeral, and consoling remarks were made; a very large procession followed her remains to the grave.
