Prominent Citizen of Davis Co. Succumbs to Injuries Received in Runaway Accident.

Funeral of Dr. E. G. Williams—Two Suits for Divorce—Accidental Shooting—Hand Crushed.

Ogden, Utah, Aug. 7.—Andrew Patterson, one of the best known men of Davis county, died yesterday morning at his home at Clinton, after a lingering illness from paralysis, which resulted from an accident he suffered three months ago by being thrown out of a wagon in a runaway. Everything that medical skill and loving hands could do for him was done, but to no avail, and he gradually grew weaker until the end came peacefully with his family at his bedside. The announcement of his death will bring sorrow to the hearts of many in Davis and Weber counties, where he is well known and highly respected, having taken a prominent part in church and public capacities. During the past six years he has been second counselor to Bishop Haddock of the Clinton ward. He was a man of excellent original ideas, of sterling character, devoted to his duties both in religious and public life. Two years ago he served as county commissioner of Davis county, giving perfect satisfaction. He followed the cattle business for a livelihood. He is survived by his wife, eight children, six daughters and two sons, two grandchildren, an aged mother, several brothers and sisters, and a host of friends. He was born at Utah, Iron county, Dec. 3, 1854. He was the son of Alexander and Mary Fife Patterson, and a brother of Adam Patterson of this city. The funeral will be held at the Clinton ward meetinghouse Tuesday at 1 o'clock. His remains may be viewed at his home on the day of funeral during the morning. Interment will take place in the Ogden City cemetery.

ACCIDENTAL SHOOTING.

A 12-year-old boy named Martinson was accidentally shot Saturday afternoon with a 22-caliber rifle, which passed through the fleshy part of his leg, inflicting a severe wound, which has been causing the boy considerable pain. Young Martinson with several companions went out shooting Saturday afternoon with a 22-caliber target rifle, and while carelessly playing with the rifle it was discharged by one of the boys. The bullet struck Martinson in the thigh and penetrated the flesh to the bone, while it came in contact with, and was diverted out to one side, coming out about five inches from where it entered. Fortunately the bone was not shattered, nor any large arteries severed, but from the small blood vessels he bled profusely. His companions picked him up and helped him to walk part of the way home, when the pain increased and he had to be carried, the balance of the way. Dr. J. S. Gordon was called and he found the wound, which will take at least two weeks to heal, providing no complications set in.

STRAWBERRY ASSOCIATION.

Utah County Farmers Incorporate to Use Irrigating Water.

Special Correspondence.

Provo, Utah, Aug. 7.—Articles of incorporation of The Strawberry Valley Water Users' association have been filed with the county clerk. The purpose for which the association is organized is to acquire and furnish to the lands of the shareholders water for irrigation and all other beneficial uses, to construct telephone systems and electric power plants, etc. The territory within which the lands to be irrigated are situated is to be known as the Strawberry Valley Irrigation district, and includes all such lands within Utah county as may be included in the reclamation project of the United States as finally approved by the secretary of the interior, and known as the Strawberry Valley project. Those who are owners of lands or occupants of public lands having initiated a right to acquire the same within the district described, such extension thereof as may hereafter be made shall be qualified to own shares of the association. One share and no more shall be allotted for each acre of land or fraction thereof.

No payment for shares of the capital stock shall be required, except that shareholders shall make application to the county clerk for the purpose of the United States for water right not to exceed one acre for each share. Upon proof to the association that such application has been accepted and the requirements in relation thereto, each subscriber shall be deemed to have paid on his stock subscription the amount of two cents to the United States for such right.

The amount of the authorized capital stock of the association is \$2,000,000, divided into 100,000 shares of the par value of \$20 each.
