WASHINGTON, June 6.—The national legislative committee, Knights of La-bor, has submitted to the general ex-ecutive board the report of their la-bors during the short session of the Forty-ninth Congress. It is a long document describing at length the measures that had the support of the committee during the session, and criticising sharply the fallare of Con-gress to pass a number of bills brought forward by the House laboricommittee.
