

EXERCISES IN THE ASSEMBLY HALL

**Eighth Grade School Graduates
Listened to Interesting
Addresses.**

FINE MUSICAL PROGRAM.

Speeches Were Made by James A.
Foshay of Los Angeles and Supt.
A. C. Nelson.

A large audience met in the Assembly hall last evening, where State Supt. of Schools A. C. Nelson and James A. Foshay, the latter a noted educator from Los Angeles, addressed the graduates of the eighth grade schools. Vocal selections were rendered by pupils of the Ogden, Hamilton and Bryant schools, under direction of Prof. William A. Wetzel, and the addresses of Messrs. Nelson and Foshay were listened to with deep interest by a thousand auditors.

Supt. Nelson said in part:

"In some sections of the United States public schools I am told, are not so popular as in Utah. The reason for this I can not imagine. I can only speak of the schools of our own state.

"But the public schools are brought to our own homes. Education to us is not a duty so much as it is a labor of love.

"For my own part, I have always had faith and confidence in school children. And when I read your papers, in which was displayed such a spirit of Christianity and a desire to help the poor, I saw that I had not been mistaken in this faith and confidence. In your papers I saw above all else a great love for your country and mankind in all things."

"Boys and girls educated in the public schools will see that the country is protected against all foes. President Roosevelt, while driving with a friend not long ago, pointed to a public school building and said: 'There is the future president of the United States.'

"The gates of education are now open. You are permitted to pass through them in the fields of activity.

"I sincerely hope that out of the 500 pupils present there will be 499 enter the high school next fall. If you fail to do so the cause will be one of three—the first poor health, is sufficient to excuse you; the second, money, is scarcely an excuse for the heart of the Utah parent is large and that parent will sacrifice almost anything for you; the third reason is indifference, for which there is no excuse."

"Education is a dynamic force. The man who can do a thing in the best way is the best educated. For the past eight years you have learned how to do things; your heart and hand have undergone a process of development. Many boys and girls are nothing more than poor weeds in dry soil. The object of the public school is to give the proper soil to the plant so that it can grow and prosper."

"Then you may grow in mind and heart. I want with you to enter the High school next year, and continue your studies for the greatest asset Utah has ever had, an asset greater than gold or silver, is the school children, the coming men and women of the state.

"Sunshine and rain are both necessary to life. You will experience both, but should you have only sunshine you would not appreciate it. And now, may Divine Providence direct you in life. May you be humble and loving and successful among your fellowmen. Such is my desire."

Mr. Foshay's remarks were well received by the audience. Among many other excellent declarations, the gentleman said:

"I congratulate you, young ladies and gentlemen, upon your completion of the grammar grades, and I hope it will be possible for you to continue on through the High school and the university. Education is of the heart and hand, and through it you will be prepared to rear success in life. A little later on you will be called upon to determine what you are going to do, and I caution you to be careful in your choice."

"As David Crockett said, 'Be sure you are right, then go ahead.' As you go through life be careful to gain honor and understanding govern you in all things. The nation is expending millions yearly to enlarge the navy and army for defense against the enemy abroad, but I say that the greatest enemies are in our own midst. Intemperance and idleness are our greatest foes. I hope that you, by living up to the high standards taught in the public schools, will assist mankind in being nobler, purer and better."
