**HARRY LIVE STOCK MOVEMENTS — IMPROVED FREIGHT BUSINESS — U. P. AND O. S. & I. IMPROVEMENT.**

The movements on railroads, in the line of traffic, are certain indicators of the business of the country, and taking these at the present time as they relate to Utah, they give evidence of a steady improvement that is growing in volume and power. Compared with the previous year, 1895 already is far in advance up to date, making one allowance for the great strike which was in progress a year ago. From the numerous business which characterize and measure the opening of the present year, there has been a wonderful increase of paying traffic, and now the roads have all they can handle comfortably, and the railway men who enjoy big business are comparatively busy. The rates are lower now, but the volume of business more than compensates for any decrease of income in this class.
