BY TELEGRAPH. PHILADELPHIA, 1.—The October issue of the Medical Journal contains the following official report of the autopsy of President Garfield, prepared by the surgeons in charge.

The official record of the post mortem examination of the body of President James A. Garfield, made Sept. 20, 1881, commencing at 10 o'clock, 18 hours after death, at Franklin Cottage, Elberon, N. J.

Before commencing the examination, a consultation was held by those physicians in the room adjoining that in which the body lay, and it was unanimously agreed that the dissection should be made by Dr. Lamb and Balance, and that Surgeon Woodward should record the observations made.

The body was further examined, and it was found that the cranium should not be opened. Surgeon Woodward then proposed that an examination should be conducted as follows: That the body should be viewed externally for any morbid appearances existing; that the catheter should be passed into the wound, as was done during life, with a view to the purpose of ascertaining a possible track of the bullet; that a long incision should next be made from the surface for the purpose of determining the position of the bullet, before making any further incision, and that the thoracic cavity should be examined. This order of procedure was unanimously agreed to.
