### INJUNCTION IS DISSOLVED

Ogden City and Waterworks Co. Win in Suit Brought by J. J. Brummitt et al.

BURGLAR CAUGHT AT RAWLINS

Case of Smallpox Causes Apprehension Among Health Officers-Tabernacle Services Sunday.

Ogden, March 9.-A lengthy discussion has been rendered by District Judge Howell in the case of J. J. Brummitt et al., against the Ogden Waterworks company and Ogden city, wherein the plaintiffs asked that the court declare the ordinance null and void as passed by the Ogden city council Sept, 24, 1986, and approved by the mayor two days later and accepted by the Ogden Waterworks company, granting to the Waterworks company the right to maintain and operate in Ogden city a system of waterworks and fixing the rates agreed upon and authorized to be

system of waterworks and fixing the rates agreed upon and authorized to be charged water consumers and the price to be paid by the city for bydrants. The court in deciding the case against the plaintiffs said in part:

It does not seem to the court that the second contains made in behalf or the plaintiffs presents any live question for the consideration of the court at this time. The city council is vested by its charter-with authority to resultate water rates, and if it be true, as contended by the plaintiffs, that the council has no right to bind the city and its inhabitants to certain rates for a term of years, then these rates may be changed by the city at any time, and until such attempt is made to change the rates from those fixed in the ordinance, the question as to whether the city has the power to do so is purely academic. So also is the question as to whether the city has authority to delegate to a committee the power to fix rates purely a question of thority to delegate to a committee the power to fix rates purely a question of the future, for it may be that this particular portion of the ordinance will never be acted upon, and it would therefore seem clear that at this time there is no reason why the court should declare this entire ordinance invalid, because it contains such a provision. Even were all these provisions relating to the fixing of rates and to the method of readjusting them invalid, it seems to the court that the remainder of the ordinance could stand.

The court does not deem it proper to consider the question as to whether this new ordinance is such a one as it would have sanctioned had its apit would have sanctioned had its approval been necessary by the court, because such is not the function of the indicial branch of the government. Courts do not exist for the purpose of supervising the actions of public officers when they are acting within the scope of their authority unless they act traudulently. Simply because the city council in this case has made an unwise contract is no reason why the court should interfere with it. The people must realize that when they are constituting them their agents to transact the business of the city, and if they do not want them to make unwise contracts, or commit other unwise actions, they should elect men who will not do

W. H. Eaton Confesses to Entering Edmund Tailoring Establishment,

Wyo, for burglarizing a store at that place, it has now been found that he was the same man who burglarized the Edmund tailoring establishment in this city last month. When the officers at Rawlins searched him they found his laundry marked "H. J. T." which proved to be laundry belonging to proprietor Harry J. Toller of the Edmund tailoring store. When the man was confronted with this fact he confessed to taking about \$300 worth of goods from the Ogden establishment and told where the greater part was sold to a second hand dealer and the balance cached. The goods were recovered and have been forwarded to Mr. Toller, If Eaton is convicted at Rawlins he will not be brought back to Ogden, but should he not be, the local officers will bring him back.

Council to Employ Expert Accountant -Petition for New Street.

Murray, March 9 .- At the council meeting Tuesday night the taxpayers of school district 26 petitioned to have a street opened through from the Pioneer nursery to State street. The mat-ter was referred to the street committe, and also to the city attorney for an opinion to know whether or not the city has the right to open the street if it so declars.

The road supervisor's report for January was read and warrants amounting to \$700 were ordered paid. The treasurer was present and asked that the justices' books be audited, as the city attorney had demanded a strict account of all fees received by the justice, which he (the treasurer) is unable to furnish not having access to the books. A motion carried that the auditing committee be authorized to obtain the assistance of an expert bookkeeper in auditing the books and that the city pay all expenses required for the city pay all expenses required for
