The lock stitch of the Florence is both sides or seam alike; differs from the lock stitch made by other machines in elasticity. The seam will stretch as much as the cloth, never giving way in washing, which is of great importance in the sewing for a family. The lock stitch of the Florence is more like good hand sewing. Both sides being alike, either side may be the right side, and the fabric can be sewed either side uppermost, as most convenient.
