"Japho" and later "Joppe") is an ancient Phoenician colony. An in-scription in Karnak mentions "Jopu" as one of the Asiatic peo-ples conquered by Thotmes III about 1600 years before Christ. Ac-cording to the Greek mythology this is the place where Andromeda, the daughter of Jope, was fettered to a rock and liberated by Perseus. Here also it was that the Prophet Jonah went on board a ship to avoid preaching in Nineveh. The Jews came early to this place, but it was only during the time of the Macca-beans that they became entire masters of the city. Christianity was here preached early, and the com-mand to preach to the heathens was first given to Peter when he stayed in Joppe, at the house of Simon the tanner. The girl Tabi-the or Peter when tha, or Tabea, whom Peter recalled from death to life, also lived here. Like all the cities of Palestine Jaffa has often changed rulers. ſt has been in the hands of Romans, Jows, French, Egyptians and Turks. At present Jaffa has about 16,000 inhabitants, two-thirds of whom are Mohammedans. The rest are Jews, Greeks, Catholics, Protes-tants, Armenians. The Germans have two colonies here, and the Foundation of the latter is herefly Egyptians one. The latter is hardly worth a visit, but the German colo nies show what industry can pro-duce even in Palestine. The German colonies are well worth seeing. J. M. S.
