

**ALL QUIET AT TRANSVAAL.**  
Kruger Willing to Grant Concessions  
to the Uitlanders.

**Dr. JAMESON and Other Friends  
Agree to Anti-Harby Raid  
and Wanted.**

**LONDON, Jan. 4.—**A private and reliable telegram received here this afternoon from Pretoria says President Kruger has declared he is willing to make satisfactory concessions to the Uitlanders or foreign population of Transvaal, whose demands for representation, in view of the fact that they contribute the whole revenue of the republic, led to the ill-feeling which resulted in Dr. Jameson's raid.

ALL QUIET.

The official office received a dispatch from Johannesburg at 4 o'clock this morning, saying all is now quiet there.

An official dispatch from the government of the Cape Colony says that President Kruger, "Everything is quiet and no further serious disturbances will occur. A delegation from the Johannesburg miners' committee came over yesterday evening, giving assurances that their demands for minimum rights would be granted by President Kruger and dismission of the guardsmen. He gave me assurance that pending your arrival, if the Johannesburg people keep quiet and continue to do so, the government will not interfere with the laws of the country. Johannesburg will be unopposed or surrounded by the Boer forces. The disposition was highly gratified for this assurance and pledged that committed to prevent further trouble."

"I take this opportunity of testifying in the strongest manner in the greatest moderation and forbearance of the government of the Cape Colony under responsible trying circumstances. Their conduct was most worthy of me. The persons we have just arrived. The casualties on our side are said to be severe and on the side of the Boers very light."

Another dispatch from Sir Harry Rawlinson, to Sir C. Chamberlain reads:

"Dewitt writes that Jameson's wounded number over thirty. They are all at Johannesburg and attended by doctors. Their names and the details of their wounds cannot yet be given. The number is estimated at approximately, but no reliable information is obtainable. Bodies are still being picked up on the battlefield and buried."

"Cape Town papers state that Dr. Jameson, Sir C. Chamberlain, and General Wolseley, a brother of Lord Asquith, are located in Pretoria jail, Gray and Covert of the Bicchus and police, and a brother of Earl Chancery are wounded. The Boers captured about 300 prisoners."

**Terrible Massacres of Christians.**

**COSTANTINOPLE, Jan. 4.—**The recent massacres at Orahah is said to have been a terrible affair. Official dispatches admit that 300 Christians were killed, but according to private sources, 500 Christians were killed. No further details of the massacre, however, have been received. The massacre is said to have occurred at Bilejji, an important town on the Euphrates. The outrage is believed to have been committed by Kurdish Moslems. The Christians who received these word that the massacre was exceptionally serious.

**Gov. Mathews's Platform.**

**CHICAGO, Jan. 4.—**A dispatch from Indianapolis says, in talking with a representative of one of the farmers' organizations who had been sent to get his views on the money question, said that he would not accept a nomination for the presidency on a gold standard platform. He said he would be willing to support a gold standard platform of 1892, which he believed is all right if it is construed from a western standpoint. Later on the governor, it is announced, will amplify his views as to what his fellow Democrats in all parts of the country may know where he stands.
