LOCAL AND OTHER MATTERS.

HIGH COUNCIL.—The members of the High Council are requested to meet at the Seventeenth Hall, on Friday, August 19th, at ten o'clock in the forenoon.

THE LAST OF THE EMIGRATION.—We learn, on the best authority, that the last of the present season's emigration from Europe to Utah, is expected to leave Liverpool on the 7th ultimo.

We the Jurors having been duly impaneled and sworn to inquire into the cause of the death of Henry J. Woodhull, on our oaths do say, from the testimony before us, that the death of Henry J. Woodhull was caused by a gun shot wound from a weapon in the hands of Nathan Springer, and that his death was hastened by injury received from a fall during the scuffle with F. H. Bruner, all of which occurred in Little Cottonwood Canon, County and Territory above mentioned, on Saturday, August 14th, 1870.
