

evoked the wildest enthusiasm among the spectators, especially among horsemen. They held their watches on him. The animal made a fine start, and covered the first quarter in 32½ without a skip, and passed the half mile in 1.03; the three-quarter pole was reached in 1.38, and his driver then, as though knowing how close he was upon the best time made by Sleepy Tom, the pacer, and Maud S., the trotter, touched him. The effect was noticeable to every close watcher, and while the pacer showed an accelerated and swaying movement, he showed remarkable steadiness, and paced under the wire with a tremendous swing, moving as evenly as a locomotive. A horseman claimed for him 2.09½, which was the time one of the judges credited him with, but made even figures against him to make sure.

CLEVELAND, O., 10.—The returns come in slowly. At 10 o'clock this morning with two wards to hear from the indications are that Hoadley carries the county by a small majority, Rose, republican, Lieut. Governor, by about 2,000; Whitbeck, republican, county treasurer, by 1,000 to 1,500. probably one democratic and one republican Senator are elected, and four democrats and two republican Representatives. The remainder of the democratic ticket is probably elected, except perhaps the county auditor. The complete returns may change this somewhat. The result is a surprise to both parties. The second amendment vote is not fully counted.

Noon.—The result of the election in the county is still indefinite. The official count may be required to decide some cases. The republicans have probably elected one judge and perhaps three of six representatives. The judges and clerks have been counting all night and all the afternoon in several wards. The figures first reported are in some cases now contradicted. The newspaper offices and other centres of information are thronged with anxious crowds patiently waiting for the returns which cannot yet be given. Various and widely differing bulletins are posted.

Cincinnati, 10.—The Commercial Gazette, in the last edition this morning, says:

The impression prevails that Hoadley is elected governor by from five to eight thousand majority. The full returns may give a different result, but the outlook is favorable. The Legislature is in doubt, but claimed by both sides. The Second Amendment vote is large, but will probably be defeated by the Cincinnati vote. The counting of returns was in confusion in this county, and owing to the very late work, the morning newspapers have barely a suggestion of the detailed vote. Everybody is worn out and the progress to day is slow.

Pittsburg, 10.—The window glass lookout continues without change apparently. The question of the stocks at the idle factories has not yet had any effect on on situation. Trade is reported dull as ever with no prospect of improvement.
