

LOCAL AND OTHER MATTERS.

GONE WEST.—We understand that his Excellency, Governor Shaffer left for the west, last evening. We wonder if he is gone on a tour to collect subscriptions in aid of the project referred to in his recent proclamation? Being evidently so deeply interested, we should not be the least surprised if this is the object of his mission.

OBSEQUES.—At 2 p. m. yesterday, a large number of friends assembled to participate in the funeral ceremonies of the daughter of R. T. Burton, a notice of whose death appeared in yesterday's News. The child was of more than ordinary promise, and was beautiful in form and disposition, and her death causes an irreparable loss and gap in the family circle.

"I had a swarm come out on the 20th of July. I lived them in one of K. P. Kidder's patent moveable comb hives. I thought I would see how much they would make in a month, so I weighed the hive and bees, the weight being forty-three pounds. August the 20th I again weighed the hive, the weight being eighty-eight and a half pounds, making forty-five and a half pounds of honey from the 20th of August."

MAJOR POWELL AND PARTY.—We learn that it is the intention of Major Powell and party to leave this city next Saturday. They will proceed to Kanab, and thence to the Buckskin Mountains; and this fall will make a preliminary survey of some of the country, so as to be prepared for a more extensive and thorough investigation, to be commenced next Spring. The Major expects to be engaged in the undertaking eighteen months or two years, and will give that district of country a thorough geological exploration and survey.

DEPARTURES.—The Millennial Star, of the 2nd inst., says:

We believe he returns to Zion well satisfied with his visit, and determined more than ever to direct his energies and his influence for the gathering of scattered Israel."

MONTANA ITEMS.—The Rocky Mountain, (Helena), Gazette, of the 17th inst., says that on the evening previous, at Cedar Creek, the keeper of a hurdy house, named De Rouché, shot and killed Jim Kelly, a dancer and negro delineator. Kelly made a demand of De Rouché for \$108, which he said the latter owed him. De Rouché denied that he was indebted to that amount, when Kelly called him a d—d liar, which so exasperated De Rouché that he drew a revolver and shot Kelly in the side, killing him almost instantly. A second shot wounded a bystander known as "Russian Bill." There was danger of the shootist being lynched.

The same paper contains an account of the death of Victor, chief of the confederate tribes forming the Flathead nation, the Flatheads, Peo d'Oreilles and the Kootenais. The Chief died about five weeks since, while returning from a buffalo hunt on the Yellowstone. He was the last of his tribe who remembered having seen Lewis and Clark, when they passed through Bitter Root Valley, in 1805. He travelled with them a considerable distance, being then thirteen years of age. On the 7th instant, the wife of the departed chief gave a feast to the Flathead nation, in his honor, at which four or five hundred were present. The Gazette says: "For the occasion they had evergreen so arranged as to form a shed, and had their lodges covered with evergreen so as to form a large hall. At the end of this hall sat the wife of Victor in a mourning position, and ten feet from her was piled the chief's wardrobe and all his toys which had accumulated from his boyhood. Around Victor's wife and apparel sat all the head men of the nation, and the remainder of the tribe were ranged in a circle round the hall of evergreen. The feast, which consisted of dried buffalo meat, dried salmon, berries of almost every description, bitter root and kamsa root, was then handed round to each and every person by members appointed for that purpose."

After passing round the viands all knelt in prayer for the dead chief, they next sang a hymn. The ceremonies terminated with eulogistic addresses on Victor by the chief men, in a caucus of the principal men, for the new chief of the nation. The deceased brave was vigorous and brave, and for his kindness of heart and was a great favorite with his nation, and during the ceremonies his loss was bewailed by them in a piteous manner.

"THE GREATEST QUARTZ COUNTRY IN THE WORLD."—Under this sensation the Montana Pick and Flow, of the 12th inst., says:

"Dr. A. J. Hunter and others, who went over to the Yellowstone, last week, on a prospecting excursion, have returned in tremendous state of excitement, and they declare that the richest quartz district in the world will be developed, at an early day, over on the Yellowstone, forty miles from Butte. They brought back some specimens which are indeed fabulously rich, showing free gold on all sides. They

claim to have found several well-defined lodes and would have commenced immediate development had it not been for the delay of the old Red Cloud's approach. They will return soon and secure this factious wealth. The Doctor and all the party are confident that they would have found rich placers, also, had they been allowed to continue their explorations."
