FIFTY-FOURTH YEAR.

ROOSEVELT CARRIES THE STATE AND THE NATION

REPUBLICANS GET A CLEAN SWEEP.

Elect Congressman, Governor, and Remainder of Their State Ticket.

ALSO WIN SALT LAKE COUNTY.

Will Likewise Control the Next Legislature and Name Successor to Thomas Kearns.

RESULT A POLITICAL UPHEAVAL.

Returns Are Yet Incomplete and Judges Are Still Counting Ballots This Afternoon.

The Republicans have carried Utah and the nation. The victory is less decisive in the former than in the latter. It is all one way, so much so as to occasion almost as great surprise in the ranks of the victorious party as in the ranks of the Democracy.

The result shows a gigantic political upheaval. The Republicans elect Howell to Congress and Cutler to the executive chair. Likewise the remainder of their state ticket. It seems, also, to have a safe majority in this county, as it has in most of the rest of the counties of the state. This applies to the legislative as well as to the executive, which means that the party will name the successor to United States Senator Thomas Kearns.

Returns are very slow coming in. The counting was terrific. Judges of election worked all night throughout this city and county and are not tending to their mighty task in most of the municipal precincts. It will in many cases be late this evening before they get through.

At the headquarters the returns have been coming in unprecedently slow and while there was great jubilation in the Republican camp the ardor of victory was lessened by the fact that definite figures were not as a rule obtainable. It was claimed, there, however, that Roosevelt would carry the state by from 10,000 to 20,000, and that Cutler would beat Howell by 5,000, and that Powers by even a larger vote. At Democratic headquarters the claim was not disputed.

SUMMARY OF SITUATION.

At noon today there was a glimmer of light for the Democrats in Davis county, resting on the claim that that county was still in the Democratic column, though with only a majority of 50.

Tolson, the Democratic nominee for the house from Beaver, is also elected and it is reported that S. O. White, Jr., the party's nominee for county clerk, has beaten his Republican opponent. Other apparent certainties are as follows:

Wasatch county is conceded Republican, the entire county ticket being elected by about 200 majority.

Cache county is Republican by from 350 to 750 majority.

Mojo majority was the first to send in complete returns this morning. The vote was: Roosevelt, 489; Parker, 318; Howell, 166; Powers, 282; Cutler, 485; Moyle, 24.

Rever county has gone from between five and six hundred for Roosevelt. Moyle and Powers ran ahead of their ticket. H. M. Hays (D.) for district judge will carry the county by 200. It is improbable that the Democratic nominee for county attorney and probably treasurer, are also elected. The rest has gone Republican by from 100 to 600 majorities.

In Rich county the vote on the state ticket is as follows: Roosevelt, 454; Parker, 260; Cutler, 490; Moyle, 263; Howell, 146; Powers, 273; Walton, 312; Rich, 281; Judge Hart, 455.

Plute is wholly Republican with an average majority of 50.

POWERS CONGRATULATES.

Sends Message to Congressmen Howell and Gets One in Return.
