

PREST. TAFT HAS A READY WIT

When Old Southerner Said They

POSITION ON PROHIBITION.

Birmingham, Ala., Nov. 3.—President Taft, in an address here today, expressed again his good will toward the south. While doing so, an old, grizzled man in the crowd called out:

"God bless you; we all love you."

The president smiled and replied:

"That reminds me of the old quotation: 'It may be all right to disseminate your love, but why don't you kick me?'

"But I have no fault to find on that score. The fact that you had so little to do with putting me where I am makes me appreciate the warmth and sincerity of your reception all the more."

The president urged for support in carrying out the Roosevelt policies to bring about better conditions of honor and integrity in business and affairs, without regard to party.

The president referred once to the proposition to amend the constitution by providing in it for an indefinite continuance of statewide prohibition. He promptly was asked how he stood on the question.

"I am not an Alabamian," he replied, "and I am in somewhat the position of brother Fox, who when he was called upon to decide a case between a lion and some other curious beast, protested that he had a bad cold and had entirely lost his sense of smell."

The president left here at 4:10 this afternoon for Macon, Ga. He planned to make short stops tonight at Atlanta, Ala., and Columbus, Ga.

As the president was about to enter his automobile to go to train he passed a group of veterans, mostly on one side and G. A. R. men on the other. He stopped to shake hands alternately with each one.

A Confederate soldier said:

"Mr. President, you have captured the secessionists, the Ku Klux and the rank Democrats, all of them."

SAN FRANCISCO

WANTS WORLD'S FAIR

Washington, Nov. 3.—To further the project for a World's Fair in San Francisco in 1912, State Senator Col. W. Wolfe of California, today conferred with Representative Kahn.

Mr. Kahn will introduce a bill at the coming session of Congress to appropriate money for the exposition. Mr. Wolfe introduced the California legislature passed a bill to appropriate \$2,000,000 for five years for the exposition. The bill would have raised \$2,000,000, the citizens to subscribe an equal amount making a total of \$4,000,000 available from the state. The governor, however, refused to sign the bill, saying it was too early, but promised that he would sign a similar bill if introduced later on. Mr. Wolfe will do this at the next session of the legislature.

Mr. Wolfe urged Senator Flint to introduce a bill for an appropriation for the San Francisco exposition but Mr. Flint, in the Senate, said he would commit to San Francisco the bill. It was agreed that if the legislature decided in favor of that city's interests he would withdraw it.
