

# SALT LAKERS IN EGYPT.

M. R. H. L. A. CULMER is in receipt of an interesting letter from Colonel Edwin F. Holmes, who with Mrs. Holmes is making an extended visit in the land of the Pharaohs. The communication, which is a vivid description of a sunset in the valley of the Nile, as well as places and buildings of historic interest, is written from Assuan, Upper Egypt, under date of Jan. 29, 1907, and reads as follows:

We are living in a "lot of color." If you know what that is, and are unable to account for it. Nor do we believe it can be painted, the shades are so delicate and so graded into one another that it would seem impossible to reproduce it in any way satisfactory. Doubtless you artists may be able to explain this almost phenomenal richness of hue, and I wish very much you could see it yourself. The whole horizon, from west around to east when the sun sets, is a rich and delicate mass of tints, which continues until nearly an hour after sunset, and is changing all the time. Doubtless the rich coloring of the great sandy deserts all around, possibly the particles of sand dust in the air, the smoke of the carbon of the atmosphere in the air, may account for it in part.

## THE FIRST CATARACT.

Then, too, here at the first cataract, with the great artificial portage of several miles, the desert life, as seen from the town, the stately palaces, the dark faces, turbaned heads and all these things prepared for the eye. A score of sail boats lie within the range of vision. Some of these will later become illuminated with colored lights, for this is a modern town in many respects, and directly opposite where our boat, the *Rameses*, is moored, stands the Grand Hotel, further up the river is the Cataract House, and across the river lies the Savoy on the "Elephantine Island." All large and first class hotels, full as they can be and guests arriving by every boat and train, which latter comes daily from Cairo, 583 miles away. This system of rails ends here, or at Chelila, where another line of boats runs to the second cataract at Wadi Halfa, then rail again from there to Khartoum. If one goes further than that they take boat again to Gondokoro, another thousand miles or so. For all the water of the Nile comes from near the equator, and if you know your geography, as you ought, and I suppose you do, you will realize that the Nile is one of the longest and drains the greatest area of any river in the world.

## WORLD'S GREATEST STATUE.

At Thebes, near Luxor, lies the wrecked statue of "Rameses the Great," the greatest statue probably ever erected by the hand of man, its weight estimated at 1,000 tons, broken and mutilated by Cambrases, the "Farsian Conqueror," 32 B. C., and at Assuan, the first cataract, is the only granite of this kind found. Here it is the regular formation, making it possible to build that engineering wonder, the great Assuan dam, the formation furnishing the stone used in the giant structure, and I could not help thinking today, as I walked the length of this most tremendous piece of masonry, of the statement that the great pyramid would furnish material for half a dozen such structures.

## NOT UNLIKE A MINE.

Then we have seen rock tombs of great magnificence and extent. It is like going into a mine by an incline, but with this difference, the walls of the mine drift are left rough and there is a track laid for the ore cars. Here the walls of limestone are smooth as the plastered walls of a house; are literally covered over with sculpture work of great exactness, the tunnel is relieved at intervals by square projections from the walls and ceilings, and so for several hundred feet you dip into the heart of the mountain, where great rooms are chiseled out with high vaulted ceilings, painted in such lasting colors that today they are as fresh and bright as when first put on thousands of years ago. Hidden in some inner chamber from off some other room lies the mummy case.

## INDIAN GIRL CHARGED WITH BABY MURDER.

At Carmel, N. Y., an Indian girl is being tried for murder. She is Jennie Burch, 14 years of age, and is charged with having poisoned the 3-year-old baby of Wilbur Winship. Her father is Philip Burch, half breed descendant of a Mohawk chief, who will spend his all to save the girl from the electric chair. The child is typical of the original people whose blood flows in her veins, being wild, untamed and unemotional. A peach filled with strychnine is supposed to have been the vehicle of murder and a strange part of the story is the love affair she was in for the baby, whose father she was supposed to have been born by the girl because she feared her insanity will be taken from her and insanity will be the defense. Unusual sympathy has been voiced for the little Indian girl because it is generally believed that she committed the crime while under an insane impulse.

C., is electric lighted now and the mummified body lies with exposed face under the glare of the reflector, for all to view and admire, or shudder at. The irony of it all. Their study seems

And so it must be here; and still with all their great temples, pyramids and all, it is a question if the practical good to result from the building of the
