

Detroit, 1.-The members of the Amalgamated Steel and Iron Asso-Amaigamated Steel and Iron Asso-ciation, employed at Bough's steam forge of this city, and the Eureka Iron Works, of Wyandotte, held a meeting and decided to postpone their strike ten days. There are 200 men employed at Bough's forge who belong to the Union. Bough declar-ed if a strike takes place, he will continue the business just the same. It is probable that if the employees of the Eureka decide to strike, the works will be shut down. There are 60 men working at this estabare 60 men working at this establishment.

Cleveland, 1.—The threatened strike will probably not change af-fairs in this city. The Cleveland Rolling Mill Company's Works have shut down for some time, but are expected to resume before long as now the Union Works, and the Forest City Iron Company employs 100 men and the Union Rolling Mill Company, having 200 men who have signed the scale and are running as usual. Other iron and steel works here that employ non-union men are not affected.

Minneapolis, Min., 1.—To-day 105 man employed by Youmans Bros., and Hodgin's saw mills struck for an increase of wages. A general strike among the workmen in the saw mills is expected to day for an

saw mills is expected to day for an advance of 25 cents. The brickiayers on the C. M. & St. Paul car shops, 60 in number, struck for an advance of fifty cents. Louisville, 1.—Two hundred and fifty men in the Central Rolling Mill have struck.

Shamokin, Pa., 1.—The miners at the Buckridge colliery struck for an advance of 10 cents a car.
