

LAYING OF THE NEW WATER MAINS

Action on the Moran Contract Again Deferred by Council.

NO MONEY IN TREASURY.

Finance Committee Requested to Report on a Plan for Raising Funds by Next Meeting.

A special meeting of the City Council was held last evening for the purpose of considering the question of letting the contract for the laying of the new water mains to P. J. Moran, in accordance with the recommendation of the board of public works...

The meeting was called to order by President Buckley at 8 o'clock, and all the members were present except General Smith. A rumor had gained currency in the evening that the Council would take up the police matter...

The finance committee report was read by Mr. Moran. He stated that the Moran contract for laying water mains with cast iron pipes and wooden valves was the most economical...

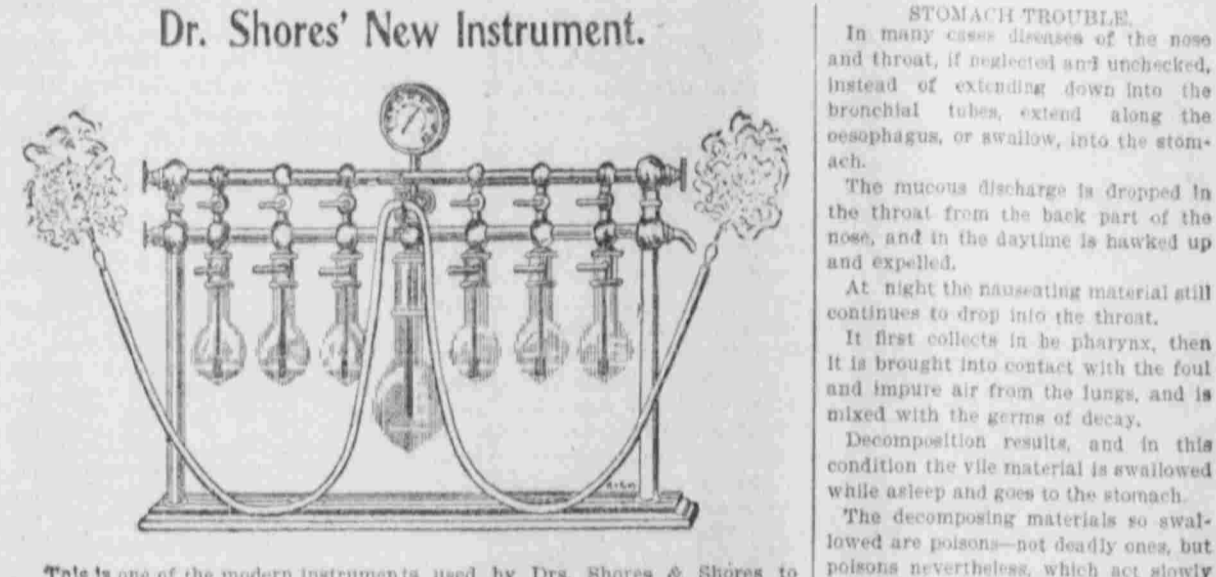
