INCREASES HOLDINGS. Uncle Jesse Knight Displays More Faith in American Fork. A correspondent writing from Amer-ican Fork states that "Uncle" Jesse Knight and associates have increased their holdings in the American Fork mining district during the past month mining district during the past month by getting possession of more mining ground on Miller hill. The latest ac-quisition is bounded on the northeast by the Mountain Dell Mining company and Pacific Mining company, on the northwest by the Texan Mining com-pany and the Millar Mining company, on the southwest by the Whirlwind and Dutchman Mining companies, and on the southeast by the American Fork canyon creek. In this plot they have over 200 acres of ground which, they feel, represents the cream of Millar hill, as it takes in all of the mineral bearing limestone. This property will be incorporated and will tend to form the third large mining company which the Knight people have acquired in this district within the past year, the other two being the Mineral Flat and the Mayor Evans Consolidated Mining companies. From the ground which they have recently acquired the Knight people expect some big results, as the ground is bounded on three sides by ground which is now working in ore, and which all trend into the Knight ground.
