Strange Revival of an Old Murder Which Occurred in San Francisco.

MYSTERIOUS DISAPPEARANCE.

The gang is making about twenty-five miles each day, and it is estimated that the wire will be strung between New York and Laramie about Friday evening. The wire which is being used for this work is extra heavy. It costs 15 cents per pound, and the aggregate amount is \$125,000. This, with the cost of labor, will bring the total cost to \$175,000.
