Heavy Rain Near Tombstone.

Tueson, Ariz., July 23 .- A Star spe cial from Tombstone says the rain and wind storm that visited that section yesterday was the worst ever experi-enced. Huge trees were uprooted and carried hundreds of feet away, roofs were taken off houses and in two in-

stances walls were blown down. Th wind attained a velocity of 65 miles a hour. The tracks of the El Paso and Southwestern at Fairbanks were torn up. Three bridges on the Tombstons branch of the railroad were destroyed The storm broke with greatest fury be-tween the Dragoon mountains and Fairbanks. Great floods of water rushed down at the latter place, which is under six feet of water. Railroads at that point will suffer damages to the extent of \$25,000. No loss of life is reported.

Kansas City, Mo., July 23 .- Because an increase of about 7 cents a ton hat was granted the coal miners of the southwest at the Filtsburg, Kan., min-ers, and operators' conference, which President John Mitchell has been at-tending, the operators have decided to ncrease the price to consumers from 0 cents to \$1 a ton.

Attempt to Wreck S. P. Train.

Visalia, Cal., July 23 .- An attempt was made to wreck an eastbound train on the Southern Pacific today. A huge pile of rocks was placed on the tracks near Farmersville. The engineer did not see the obstruction in time to bring his train to a standstill and the pile of rocks was struck while the train was moving about six miles an hour. The concussion was heavy and the pas songers were shaken up considerably. Sheriff Collins has gone to the scene but has been unable to trace the miscroants.
