

Salt Lake Brick Yards.—Any one who entertains the erroneous idea that Salt Lake is using nothing but imported brick during her current building boom, should take a stroll through the northeastern quarter of the city, and visit the brick-yards of Butcherville. He will find, if he does so, that the boast of our country, contempered by our city edifices are constructed of material produced beyond her corporate limits, admits of a great deal of qualification. A News' reporter recently made successive calls at the brickyards of Mr. Brain, Mr. Simpson and Messrs. Brady & Cheshire. At Brain's they found 12 hands, men and boys, busily at work filling in the sixth kiln of the season. Each kiln contains from 100,000 to 125,000 bricks, of very good quality, which are sold as fast as they can be turned out. The fatal accident which occurred there some time ago, together with the bad weather and a shortness of hands, operated somewhat detrimentally to business this year, but since fine weather resumed, the prospect has brightened and work is being done more rapidly forward. The proprietor of this yard is the well known master-mason and builder, Edward Brain, of the 20th Ward.

Brady and Cheshire's establishment adjoins the above, and employs a force of 10 hands. They are now on the 9th or 10th kiln of this year's business, and are turning out about the rate of 7,000 per day. They continually receive orders, and as fast as bricks are burnt, teams are engaged in hauling them away. At Simpson's, the force of employees is still larger, there being 25 laborers, busy as bees producing from 115,000 to 118,000 per week. Their machine has a capacity of 60 bricks to the minute. These also are sold as fast as they come from the kiln, and the present demand far exceeds the supply.

At all three places circumstances are similar, the building boom has created such a call, that the most strenuous efforts are inadequate to furnish the needs of the market. The price per thousand has advanced from \$7 to \$7.50 and \$8, according to quality. This will explain why some of the outside brick-making settlements vainly imagine that they have secured the patronage of our builders over the heads of home producers, when the fact is that the custom they receive is but the surplus here declined for reasons given above.

The Catholic Hospital and other large buildings are using immense quantities of the Salt Lake brick, and as stated, the market cannot be supplied without recourse to other sources. Brentages, bad weather and scarcity of labor have set matters back somewhat at all the yards this season, but business is now pushing ahead with more vim and spirit than ever.

LOCAL AND OTHER MATTERS.

The Tonite Explosive.—G. F. Culmer, of this city is the agent for this celebrated explosive, which it is claimed excels all others. Its points of superiority over nitro-glycerine compounds are safety, economy, freedom from noxious fumes, and non-liability to freeze. It is asserted that it cannot be affected by any change of temperature.

Runaway.—A vacant buggy, with one horse, owned by Mr. Thomas Latimer & Taylor, near the depot, about 11.30 this morning. Running eastward up South Temple Street, it collided with the telegraph pole in the middle of the road, inflicted some injury to the back of the vehicle, and turning down Main Street, was stopped in front of Z. C. M. I.

Departed.—As we were about going to press, the sad news was communicated of the death of Sister Betsey Ann Eldredge, wife of President Horace S. Eldredge. A death notice in another place furnishes all the particulars now in our possession, and it was too late to obtain anything further at the time. We sympathize deeply with the bereaved family and friends.

For the East.—Dr. Ellen B. Ferguson left this morning for Ogden, where she was to deliver two lectures this afternoon and evening previous to starting to-morrow morning, in company with Sister Zina D. Young, for the Eastern States. The object of their journey abroad has been stated heretofore. They have been blessed and set apart under the hands of the First Presidency of the Church. They will travel as far as New York in company with Lieutenant Willard Young, U. S. A., who goes to resume his duties at the Military Academy at West Point. We wish them all a pleasant trip, and a profitable experience while away.

Murder at Moab.—On the evening of the 7th ult., John Kalemberg, a storekeeper of Moab, Emery County, was shot dead in his own house by some unknown party, it is supposed for the purpose of robbery. W. A. Pierce, a citizen of that place, writes under date of the 8th ult., that Thomas M. Pritchett, who lives at the Old Fort, about a quarter of a mile from the store, says he heard the report of firearms on the night of the 7th inst., which aroused him from bed, and that just afterwards James Porter, Alfred Peterson and Christian Yarnes came in from the outside of the Fort, saying they had heard loud talking and fire gunshots down at Kalemberg's store. The four men then proceeded to the place, found the door open and after repeated calls to Kalemberg, heard groanings in response, evidently made by a dying man. They then got two other men, and calling again, received no reply. Just then four men rode towards the store from the west. The surrounding party halted them and forbade nearer approach, unless they gave their names. They replied that the store was known to be empty, and was about one mile east, and rode reluctantly. The first party then lit a lantern and entered the house, where they found Kalemberg dead upon the floor, with three pistol-shot wounds in the left thigh, one of them in the rear and ragging up into the bowels. In the morning an inquest was held, when a verdict was rendered in accordance with the facts mentioned.
